Nepal, one of the poorest yet most beautiful countries in the world, is wedged between China and India with barely a narrow flat strip in the south, rising rapidly north to the highest peaks in the world. So, it is difficult to survive as a self-sufficient farmer, in the few public, industrial or tourist sectors, but especially as day laborers at home or abroad as a modern slave. Shortage of affordable medical care and meagerly equipped schools does not make it easy to live, rather survive.



That is why this non-profit organization Himalayan Projects was founded, to structurally improve and, above all, to stimulate on a small scale. Small projects with a big impact!

Ripples in an ocean of mountains.

How it all started in 1997.



While trekking in Chitre at 2400m on the Annapurna-Pun Hill route, there appeared to be numerous hotels but no school. With sponsorship money and labor from the local population, we built this primary school that started in 1999: the 'Shree Lali Gurans Primary School', where all children go to school for free.

With the help of volunteer teachers, we work on quality education and were declared 'Best primary school in Myagdi district'. In the meantime, water supplies, swings, sports fields and a youth center were added here. A medical post followed later, including a dental cabinet with volunteers.



Since then, we built and renovated numerous schools in remote villages. Computer and other classrooms as well as toilets were installed. Volunteer teachers from our country started teaching there and schoolchildren were sponsored. And this is our educational component.



What will we do from 2024 onwards?

Another part of our objectives is basic medicine. After 18 years of operating a medical post near our first school in Chitre, we opened a dental clinic 'Nayagaun Dental' in Pokhara at the end of 2024. Fair prices and free treatments for children and the poor.

From here we visit local public schools for free check-ups and treatment at our clinic. This is also our starting point for the annual mobile camps with our Bsurre-team to remote villages with our own doctors and dentists.



Other examples:

In the far east we support the medical post in Ghunsa at 3600m! In the south we pump and filter drinking water with solar energy for hundreds of landless people.

In the Everest area we built a concrete walkway over a wild river and elsewhere we built numerous (mother) committee houses.
